Accelerated reception classrooms for new students from

non-Latin cultures

Why?

- You have just arrived in Catalonia, where the language used in the public education system is Catalan.
- Accelerated reception classrooms are a new, freeof-charge service to provide support for newly arrived students whose language differs significantly. In other words, non-Latin cultures which do not use the Latin alphabet.
- In these classrooms we will be helping students through specific support for them to gain confidence and more swiftly acquire a basic knowledge and command of Catalan (level A2) to guarantee a positive integration and path of education at their secondary school.

What will students learn?

- Accelerated reception classrooms have around 20 students, with 2 full-time teacher-tutors.
- Intensive training is given in communication skills, including language skills, social and cultural skills and the psychopedagogical and emotional follow-up required. Wherever possible, the service will also provide physical education, music classes and education in the visual and plastic arts.
- The training runs from September to January and from February to June, with **30 hours a week** of class time, similar to the timetable at secondary schools.

Where?

• There are 10 accelerated reception classrooms in Barcelona. We will assign you a classroom according to proximity and availability.

Who is it for?

- Foreign students in their 1st, 2nd or 3rd year of secondary school (ESO) who have not previously been enrolled at any school in Catalonia.
- Students in their fourth year of secondary school, if the orientation service at the Education Consortium sees fit after an initial interview.

Important

- Enrolment should be completed at the secondary school assigned to you.
 - You can request a **school meal** at the secondary school you enrol at, if you meet the requirements.
